

COMPANY BIOS

Emma Ackerman holds a B.A. from Gettysburg College, where she double majored in English and Theatre Arts with a minor in Classical Studies, and an M.A. in Performance from the University of Chichester. In the last decade-plus at Touchstone, she has enjoyed extensive hands-on involvement in production, with roles including stage management (The Tempest, A Resting Place, Young Playwrights' Festival), lighting design (The Pan Show, The Whitman Piece, Mae Swe), directing (Starry-Eyed, YPF), and performance (Follies, Journey from the East, Holy Stuff). During the pandemic, her work has expanded to include video editing, digital art, animation, and co-creating the Letters from Far mailbased storytelling series. When not immersed in production, Emma assists with marketing, teaches in the arts education classroom, and manages the print and digital design work.

Sam(antha) Beedle is a local performance-based artist. From Shakespeare to *Noises Off* to *Parallel Lives: The Kathy & Mo Show*, Sam specializes in comedy. This is her fourth *Follies*, and she is so excited to have the chance to do it LIVE and IN PERSON this year! When she's not creating content with Touchstone, you can find her doing improv comedy around town with the talented women of Synced Up and the star studded Barn People. Jessica Boothe has a B.A. in Communication and Theatre from Robert Morris University. She has worked around the Pittsburgh area for most of her career. Jessica is in her second year with Touchstone Theatre and Moravian University's M.F.A in Performance Creation program. She loves Christmas and is so excited to be spreading cheer in the Christmas City, that she now calls home.

Chris Egging is an actor/director/designer originally from Sidney, NE. Chris moved to Bethlehem in 2014 and is very happy to call the Lehigh Valley home. TD & Lighting Design credits include all Touchstone productions since joining as an Ensemble Associate in the fall of 2019, and Technical Director/Master Carpenter for Moravian University productions of An Enemy of the People (Spring 2020) and Antigone (Fall 2021) – the latter of which he also served as Lighting Designer. Chris has worked professionally as an actor with The Virginia Shakespeare Festival (Williamsburg, VA), NTC Productions (Omaha, NE), Gaslight Dinner Theatre (Dickson, TN), among others. He has been seen as an actor locally with Civic Theatre of Allentown, Between the Lines Studio Theatre, Star of the Day, Global ImpACTors Group, Allentown Public Theatre, and the Pennsylvania Playhouse, and recently making his film debut playing 7 characters in Living Proof Pictures' The Bitter Taste of Ginger. He is a working stage director and adjunct professor with Moravian University and Northampton Community College. Directing credits include: The Mousetrap, SubUrbia, The Pillowman, Waiting for Godot, and Man of La Mancha, among others. Chris received a BFA in Theatre & Dance Performance from the University of Wyoming and an MFA in Acting from the University of Houston Professional Actor Training Program.

Adam Ercolani holds an M.F.A. in Performance Creation from Moravian University and a B.A. in English and B.S. in Business Administration from Misericordia University. Since relocating to the Lehigh Valley in 2019, he has been involved in a number of productions in various capacities including: with Touchstone Theatre, Christmas City Follies XX and XXI, Beyond Utopia, Pothole, ISO/NATION Presents, ALOUD, An Imagined

America, and Is Love So Small a Pain?; and solo, Permanent, Permanent. He currently works as a Marketing & Development Associate and Teaching Artist at Touchstone Theatre and as a substitute teacher for the Bethlehem Area School District and has previously worked at Lehigh University as a Production Manager. Adam is thrilled to be returning to the world of Follies for a third year!

Bill George received his B.A. in English Literature from Lehigh University and his M.F.A. in Acting/Directing from the Dallas Theatre Centre of Trinity University, San Antonio, Texas. He studied mime with Paul Curtis of The American Mime Theatre, founded the People's Theatre Company in 1977 and later founded Touchstone Theatre in 1981 with his wife, Bridget, and his creative partner, Lorraine Zeller, where he was Producing Director until 1990. During a hiatus from Touchstone in 1996, Bill created Little Pond Arts Retreat in Nazareth, Pennsylvania with his wife Bridget—a retreat center dedicated to exploring art, spirituality and harmony with Nature—and toured to Switzerland, Australia, New Zealand, Britain, and throughout Canada and the United States with his original dramas: The Kingfisher's Wing and The Marriage of Munirih Khanum. Bill returned to Touchstone as a full-time Ensemble Member in 2003 where he has won numerous awards over the years—including a Fringe First at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland and a Pennsylvania Solo Theatre Arts Fellowship. Bill has served as a panelist and adjudicator for the National Endowment for the Arts, the Maryland State Arts Council and the Barrymore Awards of Philadelphia.

Sara Group is a theatre artist from Philadelphia with special interests in Shakespeare, clown, and general silliness. She has a BFA from NYU and is now in her second and final year of the Touchstone/Moravian MFA program. As such, this is her second time in *Follies*, but the first time doing it live. While in the program, she created a solo show called *Speak in Starts*, which was a fast-paced journey through some of her favorite Shakespeare characters she's played, including Viola, Cassius, and Titania. She also created an audio piece called *Welcome Home*, which takes you on a tour around your own house with the hope that you will see it in a new (or renewed) light. She is currently working on another audio project for her thesis, which will be a theatricalized audio description of a national park. Thanks to Sean, the Iggies, and that Christmas tree costume.

Krystal Hall is in her first year at Touchstone/Moravian University's MFA program in Performance Creation. She got her undergraduate degree in Theatre with an Acting Concentration as well as a minor in Dance at Muhlenberg College. Hall's previous credits include Magic, Raisin in the Sun, Antigone and for colored girls who have considered suicide/when the rainbow is enuf, at Muhlenberg College. Krystal works as the Alumni Director for the M.U.L.E. Community Cabinet and as a Direct Support Staff for Lehigh Valley Community Connections.

James Jordan has called Touchstone Theatre his artistic home for its last sixteen seasons. He has helped produce countless events since arriving and has served in multiple capacities including director, designer, composer, actor, and playwright. Some of James's most notable artistic contributions were serving as Project Director for Festival Unbound, A Resting Place, Journey from the East, and his original series of musical comedies under The Pan Show title, which chronicles the misadventures of the Greek God Pan as he is placed into modern day America, co-written with Touchstone Ensemble Affiliate Christopher Shorr. These projects have brought accolades in the form of awards given by Bethlehem's local press; notable amongst these honors were "Producer of the Year" and "Best Original Play." Before coming to Touchstone, James worked at the

Zoellner Arts Center on Lehigh University's campus. During his five-year tenure as Zoellner's Stage Coordinator, he helped in the production of hundreds of events – from lectures to Broadway musicals to some of the best ballets and orchestras in the world. Over the years, James freelanced with many production companies as a sound and lighting technician and designer. James holds a BS in Telecommunications (video production) with minors in both Theatre and Music from Kutztown University, an MA in Performance from the University of Chichester, and an MFA in Creative Practice from Plymouth University's Transart Institute. He currently serves as the Program Director for the Touchstone Theatre/Moravian University MFA in Performance Creation.

Lisa Jordan holds a BA in theatre and minor in music from Kutztown University. After serving as Production/Administrative Intern at Civic Theatre of Allentown for their 2000-01 season, she came to Touchstone to stage manage *Christmas City Follies '01*. This initial experience with ensemble-created work opened her eyes to a whole new world of theatre creation, and Lisa joined the company as Production Manager. In 2005, she joined the Ensemble, and in 2008 became the Managing Director. Though administrative responsibilities are her primary focus, over the last two decades, Lisa has filled many creative roles, including: director, stage manager, lighting designer, props designer, and costume designer. *Follies* costume design holds a special place in her heart thanks to all the quirky characters that annually grace the stage and keep her on her toes.

Abbie-Jean Litman is thrilled to be performing in *Follies* for her second year but her first year live! Abbie-Jean is a second year MFA Performance Creation student at Moravian University with Touchstone Theatre. You may have seen her perform at Touchstone Theatre in *Christmas City Follies 2020, Salvage (Fresh Voices), After Everything (Fresh Voices), and Is Love So Small A Pain? (Festival Unbound). Her hope is that this holiday season brings you and your loved ones warmth, love, and joy, and that <i>Christmas City Follies* can do the same for you! Happy Holidays!

Robert Mills is thrilled to be a part of *Christmas City Follies* this year. He is a first year M.F.A. student with Touchstone/Moravian University. Robert holds a B.A. in Theatre from Oklahoma Baptist University and a M.A. in Theatre from Oklahoma State University. Some of his favorite roles include Jerry in *The Zoo Story*, Mr. Frank in *The Diary of Anne Frank*, and his one man show *Plastic Illusions* based on the characters of Tennessee Williams. Jenny is currently pursuing her B.A. for integrated studies with a minor in theatre while interning at Touchstone Theatre.

Katie Anne Phykitt is a director and performer in her first year as a graduate student at Touchstone Theatre/Moravian University. Katie is a graduate of Messiah University's theatre program where she earned her B.F.A. in Musical Theatre in 2021. The same year,

Katie received recognition from the Kennedy Center for her direction of Antigone. During her time at Messiah, she participated in over thirty productions on the performance, creative, and technical ends, and was a director and officer for the APO Theatre Honor Society at her school.
